1 Schedule

2 Location of Race Office and Flagpole

- 2.1 The Race Office is located in the RBYC Sailing Office.
- 2.2 Signals ashore will be displayed on the flagpole in the RBYC rigging yard.
- 2.3 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 20 minutes'.

3 Class Flag

4 Marks

The marks are described in Appendix A.

5 The Start

- 5.1 The start will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Committee Vessel and the starting mark as designated in Appendix A.
- 5.2 A boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes rule A4.

6 Grand Prix Finish

- 6.1 The finishing line is between the staff displaying a blue flag on the Start / Finish Vessel and the Finish mark
- 6.2 When the leading boat rounds mark 2p for the final time, the Start / Finish Vessel will display the Finish flag with a sound signal. The vessel at mark 2s may display a repeater Finish flag. The Finish flag on the Start / Finish Vessel will be removed at the end of the finishing window time limit or when all boats have finished.
- 6.3 All boats that:
 - a) Have completed a lap before the Finish flag is displayed, but then fail to finish while it is displayed, or
 - b) Cross the finishing line while the Finish flag is displayed,

shall be deemed to have finished irrespective of the number of laps they have completed. Their positions in the race will be based on the order when they either completed their last lap or finished, with those having completed more laps finishing ahead of those with fewer laps. This changes RRS 28.1 and A4

6.4 [DP] When the Finish flag is displayed, all boats on a downwind leg shall round mark

2p and sail to the finishing line. Boats that round mark 2p when the Finish flag is displayed shall not attempt a further lap.

6.5 [DP] A boat racing may be instructed by an official vessel to return to the starting area. Such boats will be scored in their last known position. This changes RRS 28.1, A5.1 and A5.2.

7 Time Limits

- 7.1 Target Time: 20 minutes
- 7.2 Time Limit: 35 minutes
- 7.3 Finishing Window: 10 minutes

8 Courses

9 Safety Regulations:

- 9.1 Skippers and crew will be provided with a link to sign on/off on their phone.
- 9.2 All skippers are required to sign on and off using their phone. Failure to do so will result in the competitor being scored a 3 point penalty for the first race of the day for failing to sign on and for the last race of the day for failing to sign off. This changes RRS A4.1.
